Clinical Audit Awareness Week 2024

Members of the NATCAN team were delighted to showcase the quarterly reports and data dashboard during the Clinical Audit Awareness Week 2024.

Quarterly Reports

- ✓ The six new audits in non-Hodgkin lymphoma, pancreatic, ovarian, kidney, and primary and metastatic breast cancer published their second data quality reports.
- ✓ The oesophago-gastric and bowel cancer audits published their first reports as part of NATCAN.
- ✓ The lung audit published their second data dashboard describing patterns of lung cancer care over time for individual NHS providers in England.

State of the Nation Reports

The State of the Nation reports for the six new audits have been prepared and are currently under review by funders.

The reports will provide a national picture of care and highlight variation between organisations, with targeted recommendations to drive quality improvement.

Publication is expected in September.



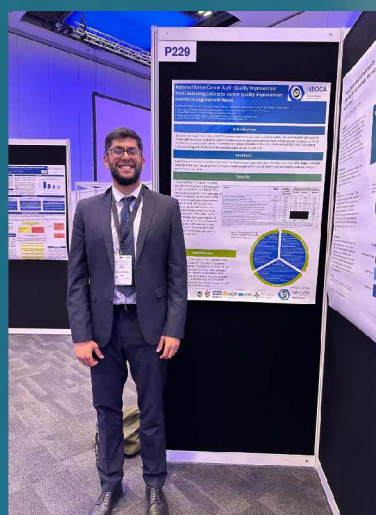
Audit Activities: Promoting the Work of the Audits
