
Established Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) Forums for each audit, placing the voice of people with lived experience of cancer at the heart of our work.



Published <u>Quality Improvement plans</u>, underpinned by extensive engagement to ensure our QI goals address the needs of the whole cancer care community.



Worked with stakeholders to develop performance indicators to ensure each audit asks the right questions and can make fair and accurate comparisons between NHS providers.



Published State of the Nation reports for the four 'established' audits (<u>bowel</u>, <u>lung</u>, <u>prostate</u> and <u>oesophago-gastric</u> cancer) in addition to <u>the first results from the six 'new' audits</u> (breast [primary and metastatic], kidney, ovarian, pancreatic cancer and NHL), alongside patient summaries developed with our PPI Forums.

Held our first QI event and initiated plans to develop QI interventions for each audit.
